What is PRB?

Project Rebuild (PRB) started in 2012 as a 60-90-day truancy intervention and prevention program to address chronic absenteeism, tardiness, truancy, and school refusal in Lake County Indiana. Although the Truancy Termination Service Standard has been around for quite some time, the services standard has been updated by the Department of Children Services based on Senate Enrollment Act (SEA) 282 Truancy Prevention Policy Indiana Legislation.

Service Standards:

- Services providers must provide interventions in collaboration with the student's school, family, service providers and Probation Officer/DCS FCM.
- A comprehensive assessment of the student and family to determine the underlying needs contributing to chronic absences must be completed within 30 days of receiving the referral resulting in the Attendance Intervention Services Plan.
- The Attendance Intervention Services Plan must include both academic and supportive services that address and remedy the student's truancy/chronic absences.

Eligibility

Court Involved Youth

- 1. Collaborates with DCS, Marion County Juvenile Probation, and the Family Court to modify the dispositional decree to add Truancy Termination services for identified and eligible students.
- 1. DCS Assessment alleged Child Abuse, CHINS Status, IA or Foster care/Kinship referrals and/or Probationinvolved youth.
